Dear Parent/Guardian:

Under the Texas Public Education Grant (PEG) provisions, a school that has 50 percent or fewer students passing the TAKS or STAAR tests in Reading/English Language Arts, Writing, Mathematics, Science or Social Studies in any previous two of three years or is rated Academically Unacceptable in 2010 or 2011 must notify parents of their options which include a transfer provision. A parent of a student enrolled in the identified campus may make application to attend a campus in any other school district for the 2014-2015 school year.

It is important to understand that a student may only transfer from a PEG school to a non-PEG school with the approval of the non-PEG school administration. The school district in which the student resides is not required to provide transportation free of charge from the PEG-listed school to the new school.

Rotan High School was placed on the Public Education Grant list because the campus had less than 50% of the students pass the Writing STAAR test. Rotan High School is no longer an academically unacceptable campus as of the 2013-2014 school year. Rotan High school has made academic changes to our curriculum and staff to assure that the campus is removed from the PEG list for the 2015-2016 school year.
